


DIRECT BENEFICIARIES

Civil Society Organizations: CSOs working on the 3 thematic pillars of the call

Individuals: Beneficiaries include participants of sub-grant activities, networking events, and capacity-building initiatives within the Western Balkans.

INDIRECT BENEFICIARIES

Community Members: Citizens in the six Western Balkan countries who will gain from improved quality of life, strengthened neighbourly relations, and enhanced regional cooperation as the region moves towards EU integration.



Focus: Young people aged 15-29 & Gender Balance (disadvantaged youth from rural and diverse socio-economic backgrounds)

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Legally registered in one of the WB countries

Non-profit CSO or regional CSO network

Minimum of 2 years experience in relevant thematic areas

Partnerships: CSOs from all 6 Western Balkan countries, applying in consortiums of at least 3 CSOs from 3 different countries



NOTE* National branches of international organizations can participate as co-applicants only





The lead applicant may **not** submit more than **1** application under this call for applications. However, it may be a Co- applicant in 1 other application of the same call at the same time.

The lead applicant may be awarded more than 1 grant under this call for applications (once as a Lead Applicant, and second as a Co-applicant).

A Co-applicant may be the partner (and awarded as a partner) in maximum 2 applications under this call for applications.

KEY PRINCIPLES OF BUDGETING – HOW TO PREPARE JUSTIFIED BUDGET!

OVERALL PROJECT BUDGET SHOULD FOLLOW SOUND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT PRINCIPLES:

Indicate whether the budget is proportioned and reasonable to the proposed budget design(time plane, main outputs and results) with a focus on the value for money and the three economic principles: efficiency, economy and effectiveness

Avoid unjustified, unrealistic and overestimated costs that do not seem to be justified by the activities and the outputs

Clear correlation of proposed activities and proposed budget (i.e. not proposed activity but budgeted and vice versa)

Costs shall be related by the real prices in the country of reference

FINANCIAL ALLOCATIONS



Up to 6 projects funded across three LOTS

Maximum Grant: EUR 60,000

> Minimum: EUR 42,000



GRANT CO-FINANCING

Maximum 80% of eligible project costs funded

Minimum
20% of total
eligible costs
must come from
co-financing



ELIGIBLE COSTS

Direct Costs: Salaries (max 40% of budget), travel, supplies, project activity costs

Non-Eligible Costs: Profit-making activities, political/religious agendas, land/building purchases, personal sponsorships, and alcohol/tobacco
