






RURAL DEVELOPMENT & ENVIRONMENT

CULTURAL HERITAGE & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT


Cultural Preservation: Safeguarding heritage through archives and virtual tours






DIRECT BENEFICIARIES

Civil Society Organizations: CSOs working on the 3 thematic pillars of the call

Individuals: Beneficiaries include participants of sub-grant activities, networking events, and capacity-building initiatives within the Western Balkans.

Community Members: Citizens in the six Western Balkan countries will gain from improved quality of life, strengthened neighbourly relations, and enhanced national cooperation as the region moves towards EU integration.



Focus: Young people aged 15–29 & Gender Balance (disadvantaged youth from rural and diverse socio-economic backgrounds)



INDIRECT BENEFICIARIES



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Legally registered in one of the WB countries

Non-profit making

Minimum of 2 years experience in relevant thematic areas


Must be **established** in one of the six targeted WB countries



NOTE* For this call is not mandatory to be established formal partnerships







NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS PER APPLICANT

The lead applicant may not submit more than 1 application under this call for applications (and once as a partner).

The partner can participate in a maximum of 2 applications under this call for applications. (once as a lead, once as a partner in the project)




KEY PRINCIPLES OF BUDGETING – HOW TO PREPARE JUSTIFIED BUDGET!

OVERALL PROJECT BUDGET SHOULD FOLLOW SOUND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT PRINCIPLES:

Indicate whether the budget is proportioned and reasonable to the proposed budget design(time plane, main outputs and results) with a focus on the value for money and the three economic principles: efficiency, economy and effectiveness

Avoid unjustified, unrealistic and overestimated costs that do not seem to be justified by the activities and the outputs




Clear correlation of proposed activities and proposed budget (i.e. not proposed activity but budgeted and vice versa)

Costs shall be related by the real prices in the country of reference



FINANCIAL ALLOCATIONS





Maximum Grant: EUR 24,000

Minimum: EUR 20,000





GRANT CO-FINANCING

Maximum 80% of eligible project costs funded

Minimum 20% of total eligible costs must come from co-financing










ELIGIBLE COSTS

Direct Costs: Salaries (max 40% of budget), travel, supplies, project activity costs

Non-Eligible Costs: Profit-making activities, re-granting political/religious agendas, land/building purchases, personal sponsorships, and alcohol/tobacco



APPLICATION PROCESS- REGISTRATION


Register on BOOST Grants Platform

Submit completed application form, budget, & required documentation

DEADLINE for platform registration: 28 APRIL 2025 **EVALUATION STEPS**

DEADLINE: 12 MAY 2025 14:00 CET
